Awana Leaders

Qualifications

- A saved person with a consistent Christian testimony and Godly walk.
- A person with a burden and a vision that many boys and girls will trust Christ as Savior and become established in the Christian faith.
- A person with a youthful attitude.
- A person who is patient, gentle and humble.
- A person who loves God's Word and is willing to memorize it.

Standards

- Be on time for every meeting. Contact your Director if you cannot come.
- Attend all leaders' meetings.
- Attend all the special activities of Awana.
- Seek the salvation and/or spiritual growth of your clubbers.
- Pray for each of your clubbers every week.
- Club Directors pray for leaders every week
- Ministry Director pray for directors every week

Duties

Before the Meeting:

- Be early for each club meeting (at least 20 minutes).
- Personally fellowship with your clubbers before club.
- Help with the control of the clubbers before club starts.

Opening Ceremony:

- Get the clubbers seated in auditorium and quiet.
- Be an example for the clubbers around you.
- Take care of the clubbers who are not paying attention during the flag ceremony.

Game Time:

- This 25 minute segment of club is designed to allow Clubbers to do what comes naturally —play! Game Time is a time for non-competitive(Cubbies) & competitive (Sparks/ T&T) games that include all Clubbers involvement.
- Have fun and build relationships with the kids.
- Reinforce the lesson theme by talking to kids about how games fit into the lesson.
- Listen carefully to game rules then organize your team to play.
- Maintain order and individual discipline.
- Encourage participation

Handbook(Small Group) Time:

- Pray and review the Bible lesson. You may use discussion questions suggested on the Handbook Leader Sheet.
- Help children understand and memorize the verse.
- Explain spiritual truths as you listen to children recite their verses. Ask what the verse means. Define unfamiliar words. Show the children where to find the verse in the Bible.
- Keep records of each child's attendance and achievement. Awana record-keeping cards ensure that attendance is recorded and the date each section a child passes is recorded. It's very important to keep accurate records so that if a child loses their handbook, they can still get credit for the work they've completed.
- Be an encourager! Praise good attendance, achievements, and behavior.

Large Group Time:

- Sit with your clubbers, not with other leaders in the back.
- Join the singing and other activities.
- Be an example to the clubbers during this time.
- Help out whenever you' can with the discipline of the clubbers.
- Be ready to counsel a clubber who responds to an invitation.
